

Executive MBA - Global Supply Chain



Program Overview

The **Executive MBA - Global Supply Chain** (EMBA-GSC) at the University of Tennessee, Knoxville's Haslam College of Business, nurtures innovative, global, and integrated supply chain leaders. The program helps you develop skills in accounting, finance, marketing, and leadership through applied methodology, not abstract problem sets. With a combination of asynchronous and in-person learning opportunities, our focus on applied learning means that assignments relate directly to your daily work and help you best retain and immediately apply new concepts.

Program Design

Residence Periods

During the program, you will participate in four, nine-day residence periods (RPs), two abroad and two on campus in Knoxville, Tennessee. During these immersive learning experiences, you will attend classes, engage with faculty advisors, collaborate with peers on projects, and network with industry leaders.

Distance Learning

Our program incorporates asynchronous distance learning (DL) sessions between each residence period to bring you valuable course content in an accessible format. The program breaks from the traditional academic format of three-hour course credits by integrating business topics into the classroom to replicate how they function in the real world.

Organizational Action Project (OAP)

You will focus on issues of major importance to your organization by designing an OAP and working in concert with your company's leadership team. Similar to a thesis, the project is graded independently of all other assignments. You also have a faculty advisor who provides mentorship and assesses deliverables throughout the program.

Leadership Development Program

You will work with a faculty mentor to create a personalized leadership development program targeting your individual strengths and weaknesses, identified through a series of 360-degree assessments. Insights from assessments provide you with actionable takeaways that can be applied to your current role, including improved self-awareness, team leadership, ability to influence communication, and executive presence.
